PUBLIC HEARING #1

PROPOSED INCREASE IN THE REAL PROPERTY TRANSFER TAX

The public hearing to consider the proposed increase in the real property transfer tax was convened this 11th day of February 2003, in the Commissioners' Meeting Room.

Commissioner Crisenbery opened the public hearing by reading aloud the resolution, which set the time and date of this public hearing.

Eugene Snavley, President of the Cincinnati Board of Realtors, gave facts and figures regarding the amount of revenue the transfer tax gives to Warren County. He then stated his opinion that the transfer tax is a "penalty tax" and is unwarranted.

Commissioner Kilburn explained that the proposed increase is a way to help the growth pay its own way. He stated that the revenue is used to provide services needed because of the new growth.

Commissioner South stated that they have tried to balance taxes fairly and have tightened their budget as much as possible and needs additional revenues to make up for the dwindling sales tax.

There were numerous residents, realtors, homebuilders and developers present and the following spoke in opposition to the increase in the transfer tax:

Bob Olson, Lebanon resident, Nancy Fields, Realtor, William Kaufman, Attorney, Bill Stallman, Turtlecreek Township resident and future developer, and Sandy Blair, realtor.

On motion, the pubic hearing was closed.

David Watson, Franklin resident, was present along with Doris Bishop, Human Services Director and members of her staff to complain about the treatment he received from Human Services employees.

The Board apologized for his treatment and assured him it would not happen again.
