DISCUSSIONS

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board accepted and approved the consent agenda.

Chris Brausch, Sanitary Engineer, was present for a work session and discussed the following matters:

- Draft Sewer Agreement with Village of Waynesville—Mr. Brausch presented the
 attached PowerPoint presentation and presented the Board with two options relative to the
 rates within the agreement.
 Pay rates based on the water bills of our customers which
 would be approximately \$190,000 per year or 2. Cost = county flow / total flow to plant x
 plant operation cost. Upon discussion, the Board chose to proceed with option 1 for
 negotiation purposes.
- 2. Updated the Board of the W.O. Brisben reimbursement resolution –Mr. McGary stated he is working on the resolution and hopes to have it completed before October 17, 2013, when the current extension expires.

Robert Ware, Warren County Regional Planning Commission, was present along with Planning Commission Staff, representatives from the Warren County Park Board and various interested citizens to provide an update to the Board on the Todd's Fork Trail Project within Warren County.

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Mr. Ware stated that there is another grant opportunity, due in February 2014, to apply for funding which could be utilized to conduct title searches on the property owned by Clinton County Rails to Trails within Warren County. He stated that the grant would require the engineering design for the portion of the rail from Morrow to SR 123 and would be a reimbursement grant from the Clean Ohio Fund. He then stated there would be a 25% match which would be met in the value of the land being purchased.

There was discussion relative to the title concerns of the property as it relates to the transfer from Penn Central.

Mr. Sandfoss, Fischer Road resident and property owner along the trail, stated that there currently is a class action lawsuit in Trumbull County. He then stated his opinion that Penn Central did not have the authority to transfer title to the property and therefore, cannot offer a clear and marketable title. He then stated he is in process of having the transfer reversed through the courts as it pertains to his property.

Stan Williams, Regional Planning Commission, stated that the purpose of the grant would be to clear up the concerns of Mr. Sandfoss and others.

Commissioner South questioned if the grant would only be used to fund title searches and if there any "strings" attached to the grant funds.

Mr. Ware stated there are no "strings" attached to the funding.

Patrick Sample, Woodward-Claypool Road resident, stated that according to his understanding, the grant includes three sections, title search, engineering, and acquisition.

Mr. Williams confirmed that construction of the trail would not be included in this grant application.

Mr. Sample stated his opinion that millions of dollars could be spent to construct what could end up being a trail to nowhere.

Mr. Williams stated that there are adopted comprehensive plans that include a clear vision of what a majority of the residents' desire in the areas.

Commissioner South stated that a positive of the grant application would be to clarify ownership.

There was discussion relative to the ability to alter the trail to bypass property owners who own the former railway who "opt out" of the project.

Joann Morgan, property owner, questioned what the overall plan for the bikepath would look like.

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Mr. Williams presented the map of the proposed trails and where they would connect with the existing trail.

Frank Scalese, Woodward-Claypool Road resident, questions how much was spent on the acquisition of the rail line from Penn Central and spoke in opposition to the use of tax dollars to construct a bike path on private properties and suggested the money be used to construct a bike lane along US RT 22-3.

Kathleen Brewer, property owner, stated her opposition to the project and presented a letter from Penn Central offering the purchase of the railway from 1985.

Shirley Walter, property owner, stated their family received the same letter but upon investigation, found their deeds already included the property and they were already paying the property taxes so they declined.

Commissioner South requested a show of hand of those in support and those in opposition to the project.

Laura Curless, Clinton County Rails to Trails, spoke in favor of the project.

Mr. Sample stated that property values are not always in dollars and cents. He stated that some includes peacefulness and good neighbors. He then questioned if the total cost of the project has been considered.

Kurt Weber, Deputy County Engineer, stated that a ballpark for the construction of all three phases of the project is anywhere from \$6.5 million - \$8 million.

David Congery, property owner, stated that the proposed trail would intersect his 214 acres right down the middle. He stated that they hunt and train horses and it would significantly devalue his property. He also stated his understanding that the Salem Township Trustees are opposed to the project.

There was discussion relative to the concerns with the legal issue of ownership and it was determined that a decision on whether to proceed would not be made at this meeting.

Upon discussion, the Board requested Mr. McGary to obtain additional information relative to the court cases regarding owners.

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board entered into executive session at 10:58 a.m. to discuss personnel matters relative to hiring/promotions in the Water and Sewer Department and hiring within Children Services Department pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22 (G)(1) and exited at 12:04 p.m.

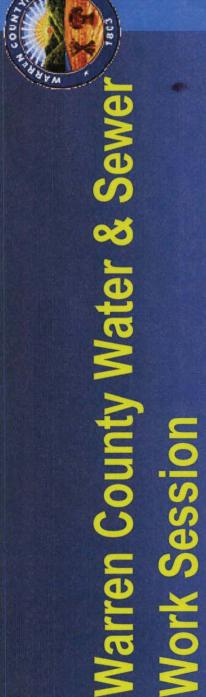

County's 2013 Sewer User Fee: \$4.27/1,000 gallons.

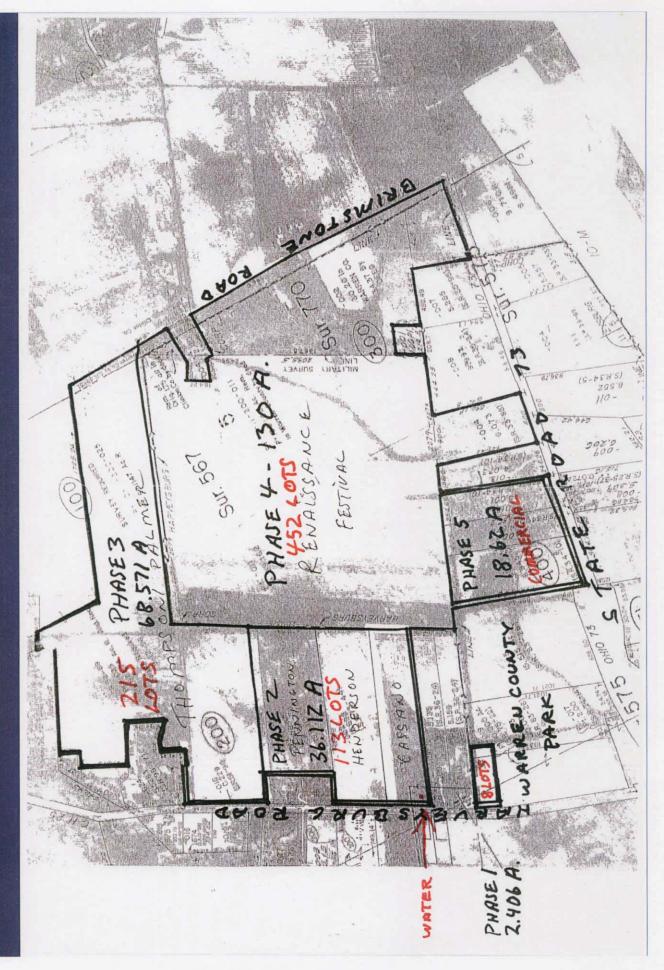
Financial Compensation Sewer User Fees

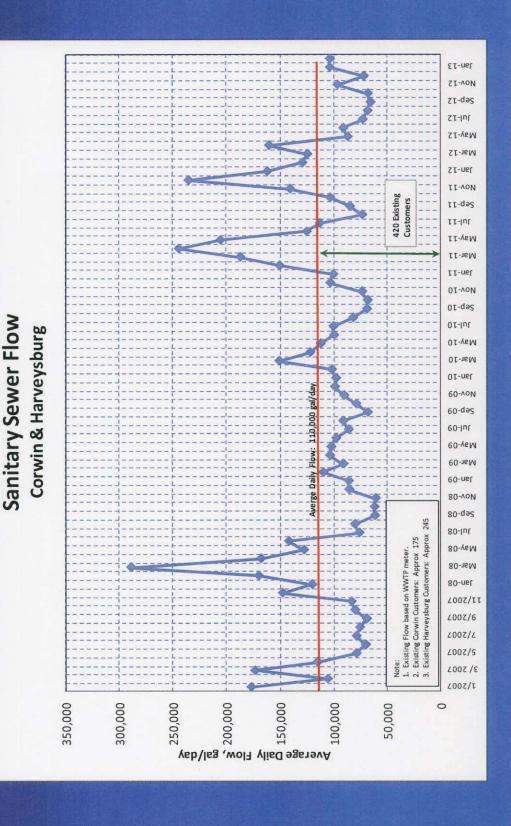

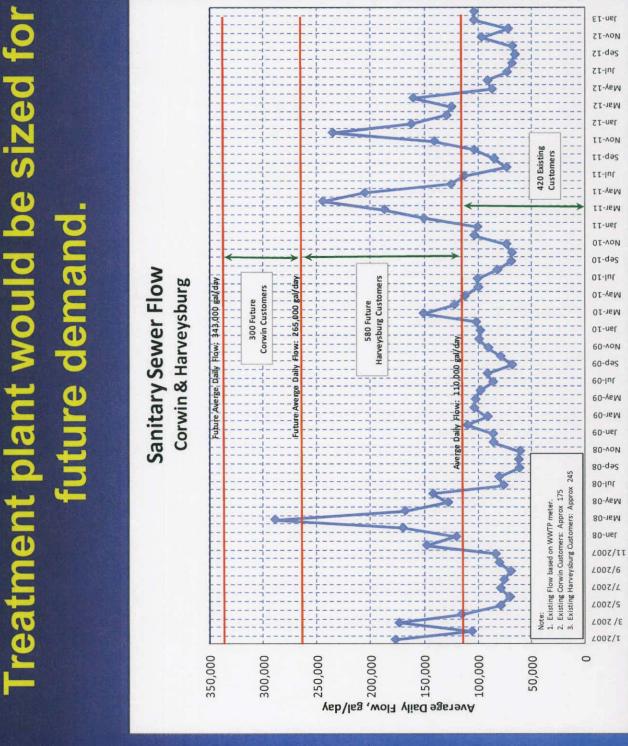
